The Rolling Meadows Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the Districts Special Recreation levy to pay for the cost of the following improvements.

1. South Salk playground project

The renovation of South Salk Park playground was completed during the summer of 2009. The project included:

- Design, engineering and construction observation to insure ADA compliant layout and installation of play equipment and pathways,
- Demolition of existing non-compliant pathways,
- Installation of accessible paths, purchase and installation of play equipment, picnic tables, and drinking fountain.

The total cost for this project was \$264,463. Costs to meet ADA compliance totaled \$171,871.

The benefits of this project to the NWSRA are that an ADA compliant accessible playground is within walking distance to the NSWRA Day Camp program that is held at Convers Learning Academy.

2. ADA Accessibility Assessment of Facilities and Property.

The Park Board engaged the services of Recreation Accessibility Consultants to complete an audit of the 6 facilities and 11 parks of the District. The cost for this audit is \$26,900.

The Rolling Meadows Park District respectfully requests that you review this request and present it with your approving recommendation to the NWSRA Board of Directors.

We request approval from the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the River Trails Park District's Special Recreation Levy to pay for the cost of the following ADA improvements:

1) Willow Trails Park, Burning Bush Trails Park, and Rob Roy Golf Course Asphalt repairs and sealcoating of all parking lots and accessible paths; and Burning Bush Trails Park roller courts:

Out of the total bill of \$32,521.50, we are requesting \$3,965.10.

- 10% of the cost of sealcoating and repairs to paths and parking lots:
 - Repairs, sealcoating, striping, and handicap markings to Willow Trails Park, Burning Bush Trails Park,
 Rob Roy Golf Course: 10% of \$23,701 = \$2,370.10
- 15% of the cost of resurfacing:
 - Burning Bush Trails Park enclosed basketball and roller courts: 15% of \$8,500.00 = \$1,275.00
- 100% of the cost of additional handicap parking spaces striped: \$320.00

Totally \$3,965.10

2) The River Trails Park District has contracted with recreation accessibility consultants to conduct an Access Audit not to exceed \$11,000.

We respectfully request that you review these two proposals and present it for recommendation to the NWSRA Board of Directors.

The estimated costs of improvements are <u>\$106,563.00</u>. The improvements are expected to be substantially completed by December 1, 2009 Anticipated benefits of the project to NWSRA are as follows:

Bartrum Park \$43,000. This park renovation included playground equipment that has either a transfer platform or ramp to access the structures. The center of the play area includes a picnic shelter for shade and accessible seating from an accessible path. Ramps into the engineered wood fiber play surface provide access to the adaptive swing and play equipment. A new 5' wide concrete path through out the park with seating areas replaces the old 4'concrete walk that was in poor condition. A new softball spectator area includes

Olmstead Park Nature Shack \$14,025. The Nature Shack is a re-purposed ice skating warming shed that is our new outdoor education center. The existing restrooms were too small and needed to be made accessible. Staff developed a single ADA accessible restroom and upgraded all the fixtures. Signage was upgraded and installed as well. Accessible walkways and paths now lead from the public sidewalk into the building.

Osborn Park \$5,000 As part of the renovations of the park tennis and basketball courts a new accessible path was built. Accessible seating areas and appropriate site furniture were installed. A new picnic shelter, between the playground and ball field has 2 new accessible tables.

<u>Site Furniture</u> \$6,000 New accessible furniture was placed along accessible routes to playgrounds and ball fields. The furniture is new to these areas and includes benches and picnic tables for all. Newberry, Johnson, Audubon, Hanson, Mead, Olmstead and Fairchild parks received new furniture.

Fairchild Park \$ 7,900 A new concrete walk replaced the old broken asphalt walk and connected the accessible bleacher area with the playground and tennis courts. The walk also connects the portable toilet and tennis courts. New accessible benches were installed.

Marshall Park \$2,840 A new accessible concrete walk connects the parking and playground to the spectator area of the soccer field. Accessible spectator space is now available.

<u>Lions Park</u> \$3,140 Accessible path from parking to bleacher areas and accessible picnic tables along the path are available.

Burbank, Lindbergh, Huntington Chase, Johnson Parks \$3,500. The majority of the funds were used to provide an accessible path from the public sidewalk to the toilet and enclosure at Burbank Park. Accessible toilets were contracted for the additional parks during the soccer seasons.

Handrails along sidewalks, Huntington Chase, Johnson and Clark Parks \$10,994 Concrete walks were steeper than 5% slope and required handrails to meet requirements. These walks were designated as accessible routes to portable toilets, and bleacher areas near sports fields.

<u>Adaptive play equipment</u> \$1,433. Adaptive swings with straps for use by schools at recess and general play for Bartrum (as per public meeting) and Hattendorf preschool.

The Bartlett Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the District's special recreation levy to pay the cost of the following improvements:

Riley's Run Park project is the development of an accessible eight-acre park site with playground, tennis court, basketball court, picnic shelter, fitness equipment, dog park, parking lot and pathways.

The total cost of the improvements to the park is \$562,215. Of this, \$96,519.00 (17% of the total project) is requested to be funded from the special recreation levy. Please refer to the attached plan and cost summary for details. The improvements are expected to be substantially complete by October, 2009. Anticipated benefits of the project to NWSRA are as follows:

Access to the park is found via the accessible sidewalk and Village multi-use path or from the two accessible stalls in the parking lot. The path, sidewalk and the parking lot lead directly to the park's accessible asphalt pathway that connects to the ADA compliant elements of the park; picnic shelter, drinking fountain, tennis and basketball courts, fitness equipment, benches, and multiple elements in the playground. The play area surface includes a poured synthetic rubber safety surface for easy access to the play structure and accessible swing seat.

The District respectfully requests that you review this request and present it with your approving recommendation to the NWSRA Board of Directors. If you have any questions or require additional information, please do not hesitate to contact me.



The Bartlett Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the District's special recreation levy to pay the cost of the following improvements:

Bartlett Reserve Park project is the development of a one-half acre park site with an accessible playground and picnic area.



Heritage Park Pathway & Bleacher Pad Improvements

This project consisted of removal and replacement of the asphalt pathway with a new 8' wide concrete pathway and the installation of new 5' wide sidewalks and bleacher pads for all of the ball fields. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2008. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides an accessible path to the ball fields, (2) provides smooth surface condition for easier use, (3) provides an accessible path to the bleacher pads, and (4) provides an accessible path around the park. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of 5' of the width can be attributed to accessibility with secondary purposes including equipment accommodation and extracurricular activities (i.e. biking) via additional width not included in the amount estimated/requested. We estimate that 63% of the improvements can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 61%. This includes a percentage of the material cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the pathway and the bleacher pads. Please reference Appendix A for additional information.

Berbecker Park- ADA Playground & Pathway

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2008. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 5' accessible path up to and into the playground, (2) provides accessible play activities, (3) enables children to interact and play, (4) and enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We estimate that 42% of the playground improvements can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 35%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the playground, cost for the safety surfacing, and cost of the concrete work for the playground. Please see Appendix B for additional information.

Patriots Park- Playground Improvements

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2008. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 5' wide accessible path up to and into the playground, (2) provides accessible play activities, (3) enables children to interact and play, and (4) enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We estimate that 50% of the improvements can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 34%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the playground, cost for the safety surfacing, and cost of the concrete work for the playground. Please see appendix C for additional information.

Lake Arlington- ADA Bridge Replacement

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the current two bridges with new pedestrian bridges. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2009. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 6' accessible path connecting the sidewalks, (2) provides a smooth surface condition for easier use, and (3) provides a continuance of the accessible path throughout the park. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation can be attributed to accessibility. We estimate that 83% of the bridge replacement can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 42%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, removal, disposal, and installation of the two bridges. Please see appendix D for additional information.

North School Park-Playground Improvements

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2008. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 5' wide accessible path up to and into the playground, (2) provides accessible play activities, (3) enables children to interact and play, and (4) enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We estimate that 73% of the improvements can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 50%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the playground, cost for the safety surfacing, and cost of the concrete work for the playground. Please see appendix E for additional information.

Nickol Knoll Golf Club- ADA Pathway

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing asphalt pathway with a new 9' path. This improvement was completed in the fall of 2008. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides an accessible path along north side of the gold course, (2) provides smooth surface condition for easier use, and (3) provides an accessible path to the northern golf holes. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of 5' of the width can be attributed to accessibility with secondary purposes including equipment accommodation and extracurricular activities (i.e. biking) via additional width not included in the amount estimated/requested. We estimate that 56% of the improvements can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 56%. This includes a percentage of the material cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the pathway. Please see appendix F for additional information.

Nickol Knoll Golf Club- ADA Sidewalk

The project consisted of the installation of a new 5' sidewalk along the entrance. These improvements were completed in the fall of 2008. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as-follows: (1) provides an accessible walk up to and into the golf course and (2) provides smooth surface condition for easier use. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation can be attributed to accessibility. We estimate that 100% of the improvements can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 100%. This includes the material cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the sidewalk. Please see appendix F for additional information.

Arlington Lakes Golf Club- ADA Pathway

This project consisted of removal and replacement of the asphalt pathway with a new 7' wide concrete pathway. These improvements were completed in the fall of 2008. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides an accessible path from the parking lot to the golf course, (2) provides smooth surface condition for easier use, and (3) provides an accessible path to the southwest golf holes. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of 5' of the width can be attributed to accessibility with secondary purposes including equipment accommodation and extracurricular activities (i.e. biking) via additional width not included in the amount estimated/requested. We estimate that 71% of the improvements can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 12%. This includes a percentage of the material cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the pathway. Please reference Appendix G for additional information.

Pioneer Park Sidewalk- Ball Diamond #1

This project consisted of the installation of a new 5' wide sidewalk and bleacher pads. These improvements were completed in the fall of 2008. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides an accessible path to ball diamond number one, (2) provides smooth surface condition for easier use, and (3) provides an accessible path to the bleacher pads. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation can be attributed to accessibility. We estimate that 100% of the sidewalk and bleacher pads can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 19%. This includes the material cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the pathway and bleacher pads. Please note that the capital project total also accounted for ball field fencing. Please refer to Appendix H for additional information.

Carefree Park- New ADA Sidewalk

This project consisted of the installation of a new 5' wide concrete sidewalk. This improvement was completed in the summer of 2008 upon receipt of a registered complaint by a resident. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides an accessible path to the tennis courts, (2) provides smooth surface condition for easier use, and (3) provides an accessible path into the park from the street and existing sidewalk. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation can be attributed to accessibility. We estimate that 100% of the improvements can be attributed to accessibility, and we are requesting 100%. This includes the material cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the sidewalk. Please reference Appendix I for additional information.



The 95Ti Treadmills the district is purchasing this year are the same models that were purchased for PSS&WC last year with the moneys received from the Special Recreation Levy. These updated models offer a smoother walking surface and larger display for greater ease of use. The treadmills purchased this year will be sent to CCIA replacing several of the older, out-dated and potentially unsafe treadmills that have been prone to frequent break down. The strength pieces the district is looking to obtain will be replacing many of the LifeFitness strength equipment which was originally purchased in 2000 for PSS&WC. The updated Signature Series from Lifefitness will be better able to meet the needs and/or physical requirements of this facility's users with varying disabilities. These machines utilize a diverging/converging arced motion that provides a more natural path that works with the body and puts less stress on joints. Many of the pieces in the Signature line have independent arms for iso-lateral training giving options for those with strength imbalances between right and left sides. The Signature Strength equipment also uses a turn-dial system for ease in adjustment as well as more gradual weight increases. The weight stacks in this series are easily accessible from a seated position which is helpful to those with movement difficulties. The Signature Series is a line of equipment from LifeFitness' selectorized strength group. Selectorized pieces, as opposed to the FreeMotion pieces that were purchased in recent years, are typically easier to learn to use and as a set, provide a balanced and structured program, which is helpful for beginners. There is generally more back support offered in the design of these pieces and each machine tends to work a single muscle/joint in a single plane of motion which makes it more likely that a given exercises will be performed correctly and safely.

The joint agreement that the Hoffman Estates Park District enjoys with NWSRA has allowed for groups from your organization to utilize our pools, the climbing wall and gyms. We would like to be able to expand upon the programming that is currently available and offer a chance for some of your program participants to learn new leisure skills (i.e., fitness/strength training activities), or perform at a higher level in their current sport. It is very common for individuals within the population served by NWSRA to become de-conditioned due to the lack ease in which facilities or equipment is made accessible. Being able to provide equipment that is user-friendly to those with varying types of disabilities is one way that we can provide additional opportunities for people participating in your organization to exercise in a safe, structured environment.

Jan Redding, a member at PSS&WC, was originally referred to our facility from Athletico Physical Therapy following a hip replacement. Jan's ability to exercise was also greatly effected by an injury to the knee and limited range of motion through the spine. Providing Jan with an exercise program she could perform on her own was challenging, but she has made great gains in her strength, mobility and balance. The Signature Strength series will provide Jan and others like her with similar limitations, a means of exercising with greater ease and efficiency and, subsequently, obtaining better results.

The Hoffman Estates Park District respectfully requests your approval of the purchase of the equipment described above.

- Installation of a new accessible drinking fountain
- New walkways to provide accessibility to the play equipment
- Installation of accessible benches
- Replacement of an inaccessible concrete walk (grade too steep) entry into the park.

Park District staff has determined that the ADA portion of these improvements should be 64% of playground cost (\$90,240), 50% of the ADA accessible drinking fountain (\$4,300), 50% of the new concrete walkways (\$2,200) and, 50% of permitting and A/E fees (\$5,220). The total cost for the improvements was \$232,500. Of that total, \$101,960.00 was determined to be the cost for the accessible portion of the park. These improvements were completed in May, 2008. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows:

- Provides a play structure that exceeds ADA guidelines for accessibility
- Provides an accessible playground surface to the play elements
- Provides accessibility throughout the park
- Provides accessible site amenities

(1) Freemotion Dual Cable Cross

The Duel Cable Cross Machine from Freemotion Fitness is one of the most universal and diverse pieces of fitness equipment on the market. The versatility provides strength training options for individuals from the most elite athletes to the deconditioned or physically challenged. 


