The organization is a two-time National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) National Gold Medal Award winner and is recognized as a Distinguished Accredited Agency by the Illinois Park and Recreation Association, as well as a Park District Risk Management Association (PDRMA) Accredited Agency.

## **Programs and Services**

## **Certified Staff**

The full time staff are supplemented by specially trained and dedicated part time staff and volunteers. A close staff to participant ratio is maintained in order to ensure quality and promote the maximum involvement of participants.
